At the Annual Picnic, I mentioned the Action of Immediate Witness passed nearly unanimously by the UUA's General Assembly last week, in anticipation of Roe v. Wade being overturned.

As you wade through the many feelings, particularly of rage and fear but also perhaps of numbness, that you may be feeling in response to this devastating news, I encourage you to look to this statement for inspiration and for direction.

We are not in this struggle alone, and as people of faith there is much we can do. This is a start.

On **Sunday**, **July 31**, **at 4 pm**, *All We Can Save* book discussion group members are invited to gather at Mary's to make pizza and reflect on how our relationships to food sustain us in the work of climate justice. This will be an evening of connection and ritual, to structure and strengthen our time together.

We will be doing Make Your Own Pizza in the pizza oven. Each attendee is to bring at least one topping to share, following this very important rule: You or someone you know must have grown or produced this ingredient. You should be able to tell a story about the specific food that you bring.

The event will be BYOB. Please RSVP to let us know who will be there. When you have an idea of what topping you can bring, please share that as well so that we can ensure that the basics are covered.

Please note that due to limitations of space, this event is for the *All We Can Save* discussion group only and not the entire congregation. But as always, I am hoping we can take some ideas and inspiration back to the rest of the congregation.

I am excited to see what might emerge from this embodied and grounded experiment in "pizza church."
