Wednesday, February 22, marked the beginning of Lent, in the Christian calendar, and in the Jewish calendar, it was the first day of the month of Adar. This is the month that gets us to spring, the month in which the bindings of winter loosen their grip on us – even as it continues to snow, in some parts of the country more than ever! It is a month in which we are invited, according to the Talmud, to ‘increase in joy.’


Despite the promise of joy, it can be a hard invitation to embrace, in the face of the burdens the world offers us. How can I embrace joy as tens of thousands die in Turkey and Syria as the earth shakes beneath them, as the war in Ukraine enters its second year, as swastikas are tagged on a synagogue and businesses in Portsmouth, as a local business owner here in Franklin shares a most disturbing email she

received from white nationalists, the contents of which seemed to awaken my ancestors in fear. With these ghosts on my shoulders and people dying and struggling around the world, how can I *increase in joy*?

And yet, I did just that. On the second night of Adar, I gathered with friends with whom I could speak openly and honestly about the weights we are carrying, the traumas we are navigating. We could process our experiences without fearing we would be dismissed, without having to explain to someone who didn’t understand at all. As we made space to acknowledge the terrifying reality we are living within, that space expanded to include more of our lives. We enjoyed each other’s company, abetted by the delicious food and drink we shared. We built connections, savored our time together, and in so doing, we increased in joy.

When things are hard, may you surround yourself with people who understand. In the midst of everything, may you increase in joy in the month ahead.




Hannaford helps in MARCH and so can you!
